

Cass Freedland is the France-Merrick Director of Community-Based Learning at the Roxana C. Arsht '35 Center for Ethics and Leadership at Goucher College. The Arsht Center provides shared, community-based experiences and reflective opportunities that serve the entire campus community and all academic departments. The Center administers both curricular and co-curricular community-based programs, with the goal of strategically supporting students, faculty, and Baltimore community partners while focusing resources and expertise toward the continuing development of thoughtful, informed, and ethical community action.

Freedland teaches courses that emphasize sound, reciprocal community-based practice, advises student groups, guides faculty and staff on how to position community-based learning as an innovative and transformative pedagogy, which includes setting realistic outcomes for this important work. Freedland serves as Project Pericles Co-Program Director at Goucher College. She received B.S. in Geology from the University of Minnesota, a PhD in Wood Chemistry from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, and a NYS Professional Certificate in Museum Studies, Dept. of Museum Studies, New York University.

Before joining Goucher College, Freedland held positions as a research scientist and the Program Director for the ibrain Science Exploration Program at the New York State Institute for Basic Research, the director of development at the Staten Island Botanical Garden and Snug Harbor Cultural Center, and the director of the Center for Leadership and Service at Wagner College.
